

On 7/24/15, I was working the 0700-1500 tour of duty, along with my partner Officer Franks while operating a MPDC vehicle. I along with my partner observed a green in color four door Altima sedan traveling westbound on M Street SE. The vehicle tag was improperly displayed and there were objects hanging from the rear view mirror. We attempted a traffic stop in the front of the lowest price gas station. Upon approaching the vehicle, I made contact with the driver on the listed vehicle, I requested the driver to present his license, registration and proof of insurance card. I asked the driver to roll down his window. The driver started to move the vehicle forward but realized that his path was blocked by citizen's vehicles. The driver then started backing up almost striking my partner who was on the passenger side. The driver then pulled forward towards me pushing me back with his car, this is when I drew my service weapon. The driver then put the listed vehicle in reverse swinging the vehicle into my path. My service weapon was in my right hand, my weapon and my body hitting the driver's window, causing the drivers window to break. This is when my MPDC weapon fell out of my hand and into the listed vehicle. The vehicle then fled eastbound making good his escape.

On 7/25/15, Officer Ryan and myself were conducting proactive gun and drug enforcement in the District. At 1300 hrs we observed a green colored late model Nissan Altima occupied three times travelling westbound on M St SE. The vehicle had objects hanging in the rear view mirror and the rear passenger was not wearing a seatbelt. The vehicle pulled into the lowest price gas station. At this time, we conducted a traffic stop for the above listed violations.

As we approached the vehicle I ordered the rear and front passengers to roll down their windows. The rear passenger rolled down his window and I asked him to put his cigarette out. As I was talking to the passenger I was observing the front passenger who still had her window up. Then I noticed the vehicle moving forward and looked at my partner who was positioned on the driver side of the vehicle. He was forced out of the way by this forward movement. We both repeated verbal commands for the driver to stop the vehicle and get out of the car. The vehicle then backed up nearly striking me.

Due to the other cars at the gas pumps the suspect tried to pull forward again but could not exit on the west side. When he backed up the front of the vehicle swung in the direction of my partner who had his service weapon out. I then had my service weapon in the tucked position. When the vehicle backed up, the front driver side window struck my partner's right hand, which he was holding his service weapon. The front driver side window shattered, causing Ofc Ryan to lose control of his weapon, dropping it inside of the passenger compartment. The vehicle then sped away travelling eastbound.
